Lujiang Village: A Shangri-La Bordering China and North Korea

Lujiang Village abutting China and North Korea is hailed as a Shangri-la of the North, thanks to its green mountains, clear rivers and well-preserved Korean culture. The zigzagging Yalu River cuddles the villages, shaping a small peninsula and creating wonderful water scenery. In spring, a sea of rape flowers against the backdrop of green mountains, clean rivers and floating clouds, is an unfolded landscape painting. Blessed with unique natural and cultural resources, Lujiang Village has trailblazed a path of green development. Its endeavors to develop green infrastructures and eco-tourism have improved the livelihood of the villagers and protected the local environment.

Laoniuwan Village: By the Side of the Yellow River and the Great Wall

Laoniuwan Village, by the side of the Yellow River, is hidden in valleys and hills, where there is the best–preserved ancient fault systems in the northern tip of Northwestern China. Its cultural roots also run deep, as it boasts one section of the Great Wall built in the Ming Dynasty, ancient kilns and ancient residences. In the 1980s, the village launched a campaign to plant trees and grow fruits on over a million mu of land to alleviate poverty. Thanks to such endeavors and tourism development projects like Yellow River Crayon Resort and Laoniuwan National Geopark, the village has walked out of poverty by developing robust ecological industry.

The Magic Annanba

Annaha at the foot of Altun Mountains, is home to wild camels, wild Tibetan donkeys, snow leopards, bears, wolves, golden eagles, white-tailed sea eagles, among other 100 species of wild animals. Wild camels are extremely endangered species, as there are in total about 800 ones in the world, and less than 500 ones in China. They are the only land animals that can survive drinking salty water, even rarer than giant pandas. Staff working in Annaha Reserve are committed to protecting their habitat that has sheltered about 1/3 of the wild camel in China. Thanks to their hard work, the population of wild camels and other wild animals keeps growing, a sign of harmonious coexistence of man and nature.

A Trip to the Homeland of Wild Camels

In scorching hot August, we arranged a photo-shooting in Annaba National Reserve of Wild Camels, in the west of Aksai County and northern slope of Altun Mountains.
